

1. Glasgow & Ben Nevis

Our travels begins in Glasgow at Dumbarton Castle, sited on a volcanic rock, overlooking River Clyde. Explore what became the cornerstone of medieval, royal power, before heading toward the foothills of Ben Nevis. Here you'll retire for the night at Britain's most special country retreat, Inverlochy Castle. Enjoy proper British cuisine, stroll the gardens or relax beside a roaring fire.





2. Isle of Skye

Your next stop is the most photographed castle in Scotland, Eilean Donnan. Perched on an island overlooking the Isle of Sky, it sits where three sea lochs converge. A bridge takes you from the forested mountains surrounding the island to the grounds where you can climb ancient battlements or look for dolphin in the shining waters below.

3. Stirling

Dominating the city of Stirling is its impressive castle which sits on basalt rock formations. A favorite of the Steward Dynasty, Stirling Castle was the location of balls, christenings and coronations. Today, it is a living history museum where you can experience 16th century royal life.






4. Edinburgh

Scotland's most famous icon, Edinburgh Castle, sits on dormant volcanoes overlooking green moorlands. It has served as a fortress and garrison, a prison and palace -- defining the capital's skyline. Listen for the shot of the one o'clock gun, admire the Stone of Destiny and visit St. Margaret's Chapel, the oldest building in Edinburgh.
