## 1. EDINBURGH

Scotland's landscapes have played a leading role in many films and television series. Our cinematic journey begins in Edinburgh where we visit Rosslyn Chapel from the Da Vinci Code and The Wicker Man's Culzean Castle. Further afield in St. Andrews is the famous site of Chariots of Fire, while Pitlochry is the setting for the Outlander series.
