Prague

Then, visit the city's massive cathedral that took 600 years to build, the largest castle in Europe and Wenceslas Square where so much Czech history played out. Lastly, watch the movements of a one-of-a-kind astronomical clock, installed in 1410.

Karlovy Vary

Karlovy Vary was built around a hot spring discovered by Charles IV in the 14th century. Throughout history it has been a holiday retreat for everyone from Sigmund Freud to Beethoven. After World War II, Eastern Bloc workers would come here to enjoy weeks of recuperation on doctors' orders. Even today, many of the spas cater to those seeking the healing properties of the mineral waters
